A Sloan Family of Hardin County, Ohio

Robert Scott Shaw

In the mid-1830s a Sloan family from County Monaghan made their way from Ireland to southern Hardin County, Ohio and established farms there. The patriarch of this family, John Sloan, was joined there by sons William and Joseph, who had immigrated earlier and had been living in Pennsylvania.

1. John Sloan was born in 1772 in County Monaghan, Ireland.¹ There he married Sarah McClellan, who had been born on 20 Mar 1786 and thus was 14 years his junior.² John and his wife had eleven children in Ireland. In 1834, John (aged 62) and Sarah and most of their family set sail for America, the voyage encountering severe storms and taking seven weeks.³ They spent several weeks in Philadelphia with relatives (perhaps with their son Joseph, who worked three years in a woolen mill there), and then progressed west to Beaver Co., Penn, where one of their sons lived.⁴ (It seems fairly likely that this son was William, since he was in Pennsylvania at this time, and his brother-in-law Rev. George Scott was living in Beaver Co. then.)⁵ After two months in Beaver Co., they set out by covered wagon and reached Hardin Co. in western Ohio. In Oct 1837, John obtained the deed to 123 acres (for \$1.50 per acre) from James Taylor of Kentucky, the patent holder.⁶ This parcel was in the southwest corner of Taylor Creek township in Hardin Co., adjacent to McDonald township. On the land was an 16x18 foot cabin into which they moved.⁷ Eight years later they put up an 18x24 foot house.

Sarah died a few years later on 20 Aug 1841, at age 55.⁸ Sarah was the first to be buried in a cemetery established on land taken from John's parcel.⁹ Twenty five years later John died, aged 94, on 26 Apr 1866, and was also buried in that cemetery.¹⁰

Children from this marriage were:

- + 2 i. William Sloan was born on 30 Apr 1803 in Co. Monaghan, Ireland.
- + 3 ii. Joseph Sloan was born on 4 Nov 1804 in Co. Monaghan, Ireland.
 - 4 iii. **Samuel Sloan,** died between January and March, 1855. As his will named no wife or children, he was probably unmarried.¹¹
 - 5 iv. **John Sloan**. He probably lived in Missouri when he died before 1855, and had at least one son, Joseph Samuel.¹²
- + 6 v. **Thomas Sloan** was born in Co. Monaghan in 1820 or 1821.
 - 7 vi. **James Sloan** was born in 1822 in Co. Monaghan.¹³ His 1883 biography mentions no wife, and he is single in the 1880 census.
 - 8 vii. David L. Sloan was born about 1824. He spent many years employed by the Columbus & Cincinatti Railway, then returned to farm in Taylor Creek township. He died on 20 Mar 1901 in Hardin Co., aged about 77.¹⁴
- + 9 viii. **Robert Sloan** was born in 1827 in Ireland.
 - 10 ix. Fannie Sloan. Mentioned in her father's will of 1860.¹⁵
- + 11 x. Margaret Sloan.
 - 12 xi. Eliza Sloan. Mentioned in her father's will of 1860.



2. William Sloan (*John*¹) was born on 30 Apr 1803 in Ireland, presumably in County Monaghan.¹⁶ William married Ann Scott.¹⁷ Ann had been born on 29 Jun 1806 in Ireland.¹⁸ From the 1850 U.S. Census, we learn their first known child was born in Ireland, their next two children in Pennsylvania, and the rest in Ohio. This shows the family immigrated to Pennsylvania between 1830 and 1833, and then moved to Ohio before May of 1836, probably as part of his father's party. Likely much of the time in Pennsylvania was in Beaver County, since Ann's brother lived there and William's father paused there before going by wagon into Ohio.¹⁹ In December 1838, William bought the 123 acre parcel next to his father's acreage in Hardin Co.; on the same day his brother Joseph bought the parcel on the other side of William's.²⁰ After twenty years on this land,William died 22 Sep 1858 at age 55 and was buried in Yelverton (Sugar Ridge) Cemetery.²¹ By 1870, the farm was occupied by Ann and the family of her daughter Sarah.²² Ann died at age 83 on 4 Aug 1889 and was also buried in Yelverton cemetery.²³

- + 19 vii. Joseph G. Sloan was born on 25 Jan 1843 in Ohio.
- + 20 viii. Agnes L. Sloan was born about 1853 in Ohio.

3. Joseph Sloan (*John*¹) was born on 4 Nov 1804 in Co. Monaghan, Ireland.²⁶ At age 21 he came to America and worked in a Philadelphia woolen mill for three years, and then stayed with a brother in Beaver Co., Pa., for a short time.²⁷ As noted above, he and his brother William obtained deeds for adjacent parcels in McDonald township, Hardin Co., on the same day in 1837. He and a brother contracted to build part of the Indianpolis, Bloomington & Western Railroad.²⁸ Joseph married **Martha Roberts** in Hardin Co. on 23 Sep 1853.²⁹ He died on 4 Nov 1877 in Hardin Co., at age 73.³⁰

6. Thomas Sloan (*John*¹) was born in Co. Monaghan in June 1820³² or about 8 May 1821.³³ As a young man he worked on a boat on Lake Erie for three years, and then worked on building the Mad River and Lake Erie Railroad line from Kenton to Huntsville.³⁴ The Mad River Road was the second railroad in Ohio; its line reached Kenton from Sandusky in July, 1846, and Bellefontaine a year later. In the 1850s Thomas went to Ireland, and there married **Eliza Sloan** on 22 Mar 1852.³⁵ She had been born in Co. Monaghan in May 1835.³⁶ They settled on a farm of 123 acres in Taylor

Creek township, Hardin Co. During the Civil War, Thomas furnished two substitutes for the Union army, at a cost of \$600. He was an Elder of the Reformed Presbyterian Church, and helped build the church at Silver Creek. Late in life he became a member of the United Presbyterian Church. Thomas died on 29 Feb 1880 at age 58.³⁷

9. Robert Sloan (*John*¹) was born in 1827 in Ireland.⁴⁰ He became a farmer in Taylor Creek township. Robert married **Jane Elizabeth Shaw**, daughter of **Isabel** and **George Shaw** on 12 Jun 1862.⁴¹ Jane was born on 14 Feb 1832 or 13 Feb 1833, and was sister of George W. Shaw, who had married Robert's niece Frances Jane Sloan two years earlier.⁴² At age 42, on 19 Mar 1870, Robert died.⁴³ Two years later, on 8 Oct 1874, Jane married John Sloan, a cousin of Robert.⁴⁴ Jane died 4 Apr 1891, aged 58.⁴⁵

11. Margaret Sloan (*John*¹). Margaret married **John Henry** on 10 Aug 1837 in Hardin County.⁴⁷

13. Sarah A. Sloan (*William*², *John*¹) was born on 5 Jan 1830 in Ireland.⁴⁹ As a young child she traveled with her parents to Hardin Co. It was there that Sarah married **Jason Weaver** on 21 Sep 1853.⁵⁰ Jason died at age 49 on 27 Aug 1859 in Troy, Miami Co., Ohio.⁵¹ Nine years later Sarah married **Urias Hoyt** on 15 Oct 1868 in Champaign Co., Ohio.⁵² Urias had been living in Urbana, but following the marriage the couple moved to a farm in McDonald township, Hardin Co. (presumably the farm of Sarah's childhood).⁵³ Urias was a Methodist Episcopal preacher as well as a farmer. In 1880, when Urias was 71, the family moved into Belle Center (just into Logan country from the farm).⁵⁴

14. Mary Elizabeth Sloan (*William²*, John¹) was born about 1833 in Pennsylvania.⁵⁷ She married Alexander Stuart of Urbana on 12 Mar 1868 at her mother's home in McDonald township.⁵⁸

16. Frances Jane Sloan (*William*², *John*¹) was born on 14 May 1836 in Ohio.⁶⁰ Frances married **George Washington Shaw**, son of **Isabel** and **George Shaw**, on 1 Dec 1859 in Hardin Co.⁶¹ They were married by George Washington Shaw's brother, William P. Shaw, the minister of a local Presbyterian church. (Their sister Jane later married Frances's uncle Robert Sloan.) Frances and George made their home on his father's farm in Slippery Rock township, Lawrence Co., Pennsylvania. At age 74 Frances died there, on 25 May 1910.⁶² Six years later, on 24 Jan 1916, George died in Grove City, Pennsylvania.⁶³

19. Joseph G. Sloan (*William*², *John*¹) was born on 25 Jan 1843 in Ohio.⁶⁵ He married Almira J. Breezley on 5 Dec 1872 in Story Co., Iowa.⁶⁶ In 1880 they were living in West Chester, Washington Co., Iowa where he was a dry goods merchant.⁶⁷ They spent some time in Oregon, and by 1889 Joseph, by then widowed, had settled in Ellensburg, Washington.⁶⁸ Joseph died on 26 Nov 1910, aged 67, and was buried in the I.O.O.F. Cemetery in Ellensburg.⁶⁹

20. Agnes L. Sloan (*William²*, *John¹*) was born about 1853 in Ohio.⁷⁴ Agnes was only about five when her father died. She married Edwin or Edward Stuart.⁷⁵ One account relating to Agnes and her mother Ann says:

Henry Scott, brother of Anne, was rich man in N.Y. raised his niece Agnes, took her abroad every year, set her husband Ed up in business. He tired of the child Theo so Agnes & Ed went to Springfield to live with Elizabeth Stuart, her sister and his stepmother. Helen Stuart born there. Agnes had cancer - Frances Shaw cared for her, then bro't Theo & Helen to Law. Co. to raise.⁷⁶

There is some reason to think the full name of this uncle of Agnes's was William Henry Scott, and Ohio natives Agnes & Edwin Stewart are listed in the household of William Scott, physician, in New York in 1880.⁷⁷
