## The Farina Family of Missouri and Arkansas

## Dawn C. Stricklin

**1. Pascal aka Pasquallo**<sup>2</sup> **Farino** (Gustine<sup>1</sup>), son of Gustine and Vengenza (Conte) Farino, was born March 1835<sup>2</sup> or 15 March 1829<sup>3</sup> in Italy, and died 13 May 1913 in St. Louis City, Missouri. He was buried on 14 May 1913 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. He married before 1854 in Italy, **Madeline Carraloni**, daughter of Domenico or Dominick Carraloni. She was born in Italy on 11 November 1837, and died 30 November 1927. She was buried on 2 December 1927 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri.

Pasquallo became a naturalized American citizen on 16 March 1897 in the City of St. Louis, 11 and later bought land in Conway County, Arkansas. 12

Pasquallo Farino and Madeline Carraloni were the parents of the following children:

2 i. CATHERINE RACHELE<sup>3</sup> "KATIE" FARINO, was born 24 December 1866 in Italy, <sup>13</sup> and died 10 May 1926 in St. Louis City, Missouri of pulmonary tuberculosis. <sup>14</sup> She was buried on 13 May 1926 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis

DOMENICO ANTONIO<sup>3</sup> aka LOUIS aka "TONY" FARINO, was born 23 March 1871 in Italy,<sup>25</sup> and died 17 April 1949 in St. Louis City, Missouri.<sup>26</sup> He was buried 21 April 1929 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri.<sup>27</sup> He married circa 1888 Philomena Jannuzzo, daughter of Paul and Rose (Mastrandea) Jannuzzo.<sup>28</sup> She was born 12 May 1872,<sup>29</sup> probably in Naples (Napoli), Italy, and died 2 November 1931 in St. Louis City, Missouri.<sup>30</sup> She was buried on 4 November 1931 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri.<sup>31</sup>
  - 4 iii. UNKNOWN<sup>3</sup> MALE TWIN FARINO, was born 10 April 1883 in Center Ridge, Conway County, Arkansas, and died at birth, probably being buried in Conway County, Arkansas.<sup>32</sup>

- 5 iv. NICHOLAS PETER<sup>3</sup> FARINO, was born 10 April 1883<sup>33</sup> in Center Ridge, Conway County, Arkansas<sup>34</sup> or 10 April 1884<sup>35</sup>. He died in 29 August 1962 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.<sup>36</sup> He married 6 October 1905 in Conway County, Arkansas, Concetta Ann Santillo.<sup>37</sup> 1918 when he filled out his WWI draft registration card, he listed his occupation as, 'Farmer'.<sup>38</sup>
- **3. Domenico Antonio**<sup>3</sup> **aka** "**Louis**" **aka** "**Tony**" **Farina** (Pascal/Pasquallo², Gustine¹), son of Pascal or Pasquallo and Madeline (Carraloni) Farino, was born 23 March 1871 in Italy, <sup>39</sup> and died 17 April 1949 in St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>40</sup> He was buried 21 April 1949 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>41</sup> He married circa 1888 probably in St. Louis City, **Philomena Jannuzzo**, daughter of Paul and Rose (Mastrandea) Jannuzzo. <sup>42</sup> She was born 12 May 1872, <sup>43</sup> probably in Naples (Napoli), Italy, and died 2 November 1931 in St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>44</sup> She was buried on 4 November 1931 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>45</sup>

Antonio and Philomena first lived on 314 Clark Avenue in a rented house in St. Louis City, Missouri, 46 as early as 1899, when the death of their son Carmine was recorded

in the St. Louis City death records.<sup>47</sup> Between 1910<sup>48</sup> and 1916,<sup>49</sup> the couple and their children had moved to their new residence on 5216 Cote Brilliante Avenue, which was the first recorded home that the couple owned.<sup>50</sup> The Jannuzzo surname was also spelled as Jennia.<sup>51</sup>

The family attended several Catholic churches during their lifetimes. The first Italian church in the city of St. Louis was St. Bonaventure, located on 6<sup>th</sup> and Spruce Streets beginning in 1871, and the parish was eventually closed in 1883 due to its unfavorable location. From 1883 to 1900, there were no strictly Italian parishes located within the city, although Italian immigrants attended other churches with mixed denominations. In December of 1899, Father Cesare Spigardi, an immigrant Italian priest, began to work towards the creation of an Italian church in the city, partly because, "...there are more than 10,000 Italians in this city, 6,000 of whom cannot speak English..." A new church, Our Lady of Hopes, was the result of his hard work, and soon afterwards, the church was renamed St. Charles Borromeo. The Farina's and extended family members, including the Jannuzzo's, attended St. Charles Borromeo's Catholic Church on 29<sup>th</sup> and Locust. But after the death of Father Spigardi in 1931, the church quickly fell into disuse, although there are sacramental records dating up to 1981.

Antonio was naturalized on 17 September 1896 in St. Louis City, Missouri, <sup>58</sup> and became a member of the Fratellanza society, <sup>59</sup> along with his brother-in-law Fiorindo "Frank" Doredo, <sup>60</sup> (the husband of Philomena's sister Mary Angela Jannuzzo). The *Societa Unione e Fratellanza Italiana* was the first Italian mutual aid society founded in St. Louis. <sup>61</sup> Created in 1886, this society, like other mutual aid societies that sprung up during the nineteenth century, was created to give job security and monetary protection (including the payment of doctor's bills and illness benefits) to the city's Italian immigrants. <sup>62</sup> But more importantly, it functioned as the means for Italian immigrants to have decent funerals and burials through both financial contributions and honorable vigils. <sup>63</sup>

According to one member of the Hill community, undertaker Frank Borghi, "...the day of the funeral, members [of the mutual aid society] would form an entourage...and in a final gesture of tribute would march by the home of the deceased...because you see, owning a home meant so much to these immigrants..." On 21 April 1949, Antonio's funeral took place at St. Mark's Catholic Church in St. Louis City, 55 and he was laid to rest on that same day next to his beloved wife of over forty years, Philomena, at Calvary Cemetery. 66

Antonio Domenico aka "Louis" aka "Tony" Farina and Philomena Jannuzzo were the parents of the following children:

FRANK<sup>4</sup> FARINA, was born 2 August 1889 in St. Louis, Missouri, <sup>67</sup> and died 30 December 1916 in St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>68</sup> His mass was celebrated at St. Charles Borromeo Catholic Church, <sup>69</sup> and he was buried 2 January 1917 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. <sup>70</sup> Frank worked as a teamster. <sup>71</sup>
- 7 ii. PASCAL<sup>4</sup> FARINA, was born 28 February 1891/1892 in St. Louis City, Missouri,<sup>72</sup> and died in 18 April 1960.<sup>73</sup> He was buried on 22 April 1960 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri.<sup>74</sup> His mass was celebrated at Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church.<sup>75</sup> In the 1930 census, Pascal was found in the Kentucky State Reformatory in Frankfort City, Franklin County, Kentucky<sup>76</sup> along with his brother Paul.<sup>77</sup>

PAUL A.<sup>4</sup> FARINA, was born 1 January 1893 in St. Louis City, Missouri, 78 and died 11 May 1959. 79 He was buried on 14 May 1959 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. 80 His mass was celebrated at the Old Cathedral in St. Louis City, Missouri. 19 Paul was a member of the V.F.W. (Veterans of Foreign Wars), and of the St. Vincent de Paul Society. 19 In the 1930 census, Paul was found in

MADELINE MARGARATE<sup>4</sup> FARINA, was born June 1894<sup>85</sup> in St. Louis City, 9 iv. Missouri, and died 16 October 1992 in Denton, Texas. 86 She was buried 21 October 1992 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. 87 She married circa 1914-1916 in St. Louis City, Missouri, 88 Nicola "Nick" Massucci, the son of Raphael<sup>89</sup> and Maria (maiden name unknown; remarried Landolphi) Massucci.<sup>90</sup> He was born 19 January 1889 in Baia e Latina, Caserta, Campania, Italy, 91 and died 11 March 1955<sup>92</sup> in St. Louis City, Missouri. 93 He was buried on 15 March 1955 in Calvary Cemetery, St. Louis City, Missouri. 94 Nick arrived at Ellis Island on 6 April 1905 aboard the ship *Koenig Albert*. 95 At the age of only sixteen years and with only twenty dollars in his pocket, he listed his destination as St. Louis, Missouri, where his brother Beniamino "Ben" Massucci was waiting for him. 96 Nick<sup>97</sup> and Ben were shoemakers. Their mother, Maria Landolfi remained in Baia e Latina in Italy. 98 On 5 December 1912, their younger brother Paolo, also called Paolino or "Paul", bought ticket aboard the ship Koenig Albert at the age of sixteen, with his passage being paid for by his older brother Nick. 99 However, Paolo never traveled on the ship; a line was crossed through his name. Paolo was born 3 September 1896,<sup>101</sup> and like his older brothers, Paolo was a shoe

worker.<sup>102</sup> Paolino Massucci arrived in the United States on board the ship *SS Berlin* on 13 April 1913,<sup>103</sup> and Paolo's passport application confirms this later date.<sup>104</sup> Paolo later returned to Italy in July of 1921 to visit his parents;<sup>105</sup> although he listed his father as being deceased, Paolo was probably referring to his mother and step-father.
